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Students will be co-developing a wiki-based encyclopedia on the History of Science. Students will need to identify appropriate sources, including where to look and how to evaluate the authority of the resource.

- SLO 1: Students will learn to develop a research plan.
- SLO 2: Students will be introduced to four resources suitable for their research.
- SLO 3: Students will understand the basics of source evaluation.

Dr. Sampson and I plan to continue to collaborate on this project. He hopes to build the wiki-based encyclopedia over time. So, in addition to discussing the students' performance with Dr. Sampson, I'll also be able to review the work.
